The Collaboration for Early Childhood

The Collaboration for Early Childhood is a model public-private partnership that leverages the resources of more than 60 local agencies to create a community-wide system of high-quality programs and services that foster physical, cognitive and social-emotional development during the critical first five years of life.

Key initiatives to advance our mission include:

Developmental Screening—The Collaboration works with area pediatricians and family practice physicians, child care providers and preschools to ensure all children birth to five receive periodic developmental screening. The Collaboration also provides hearing and vision screening to more than 1200 preschool children, and works with all providers to ensure that children who need further assessment and services receive them.

Parent Information and Support—The Collaboration seeks to ensure that every at-risk family is offered intensive parent education services, and that every parent has information and receives services they need to support their child's development.

Professional Development—Workshop series for staff at childcare centers and preschools, an annual symposium for providers and parents on key issues in early childhood, and developing a professional community that supports quality improvement through the Directors Round Table and Family Child Care Providers Round Table.

Supporting high-quality preschool for at-risk children—The Collaboration works with four agencies that receive public funds to provide preschool for at-risk children to ensure that these children and their families are engaged in the programs. It also facilitates collaborative curriculum planning and a shared learning community focused on instructional improvement.
